

# ISC COURT TEAM

ISC COURT IS LED BY A MULTIDISCIPLINARY TEAM THAT ASSISTS PARTICIPANTS WITH ACHIEVING THEIR GOALS, IMPROVE THEIR WELLBEING, AND INCREASE THEIR NETWORK OF SUPPORT.

## What is ISC Court?

ISC Court is a voluntary “problem solving court” designed to connect you to services in the community to keep you healthy, in compliance with your case plan, and out of jail. ISC Court strives to help you improve your life by increasing your support networks, helping you avoid unhealthy patterns of behavior and by assisting you in identifying and achieving your goals. This is accomplished through a collaborative team-based approach. The court team works together to ensure you receive support and services you need to stay on track. You may have had challenging experiences with the court process previously, ISC Court is intended to facilitate a more collaborative and trauma-informed environment.

## Who would benefit from ISC Court?

ISC Court can best support a person who has a desire to engage in mental health and substance use treatment and utilize services but has been unsuccessful in doing so on their own. This is a voluntary program, and the potential participant must express a willingness or a desire to make a change and participate in the program.



## Who is Eligible?

Which court participants are eligible for ISC Court?

- Those already granted Mental Health Diversion
- Those living with mental health and/or substance use issues that are negatively impacting their lives
- Participants who have a significant need for case management, a past criminal history, and are at risk of reoffending
- Those amenable to participate and follow the case plans created by the team
