

Rule 1.4.05 Public and Media Access to Remote Proceedings

Remote appearances via Zoom are ~~restricted~~ limited to parties, ~~and their~~ attorneys, and witnesses ~~as~~ when permitted by statute, court rule, or court order. In criminal cases, victims are also permitted to attend remotely, upon request, in accordance with applicable law.

All non-confidential court hearings are open to the public, but public and media access is available for in-person ~~access~~ only. ~~The media and~~ Members of the public and media (collectively referred to as “non-parties”) ~~are may~~ not permitted to observe court proceedings remotely via Zoom.

~~For~~ If a non-party wishes to attend a court hearing remotely ~~via Zoom~~, they or their attorney must ~~submit a~~ request and ~~receive~~ obtain approval from the court. This request ~~can~~ may be made ~~through an~~ orally, ~~or in~~ written motion, or by filing the local form titled "Request and Order for Non-Party Remote Access SUPAD 0100." All ~~Such~~ requests must be made at least two court days prior to the scheduled hearing ~~court date~~.
